MINUTES

John Robertson

- 1. The meeting was convened at 1:03 p.m., in Room 1108B of the College Welcome Center, by Don Oelsligle, Chairperson of the Finance Committee.
- 2. Recommended approval of the Minutes of the January 14, 2016 meeting.
- 3. Lynne Koski, Vice President of Administrative Services, reviewed paid bills for January 2016, focusing on bills in excess of \$5,000. The most significant bills are those related to the construction of the residence hall and dining facility.
- 4. Lynne Koski reviewed the Budget Development Calendar for preparation of the 2016-17 College budgets. Consideration will be given to moving the approval of the additional one (1) percent increase in the total 2016-2017 budget lid authority to the August meeting.
- 5. John Robertson, Director of Accounting Services, presented points of consideration prior to discussion being held on the 2016-2017 housing and meal plan rates. Considerations included meeting bond debt, maintaining occupancy rate, deferred maintenance needs, comparability to regional institutions, operational budget needs, etc.

Following an in-depth discussion, a consensus was reached by the Finance Committee to recommend to the Board of Governors that the 2016-2017 Housing and Meal Plan rates be set for on-campus housing with meal plan options of Unlimited Access with \$100 Flex Plan, a 14-Meal Plan option with \$50 Flex Plan, or a 10-Meal Plan option, at an average rate of \$3,865 per semester for the multiple residence life facilities, with the specific rate of each meal plan and each facility being determined administratively.

- 6. Preliminary review was given to 2016-2017 tuition and fee rates. An in-depth review and consideration for approval of tuition and fee rates will occur at the March meeting.
- 7. With no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 2:26 p.m.
